The Committee on Small Business Subcommittee on Investigations, Oversight and Regulations will meet for a hearing titled, *SEC's Crowdfunding Proposal: Will it Work for Small Businesses?* The hearing is scheduled to begin at **10:00 A.M. on January 16, 2014 in Room 2360 of the Rayburn House Office Building.**

The Jumpstart Our Business Startups (JOBS) Act, enacted on April 5, 2012, established the foundation for a regulatory structure for startups and small businesses to raise capital through crowdfunding. On October 23, 2013, a year late, the Securities and Exchange Commission issued the proposed rule designing the framework to implement the law. The purpose of this hearing is to receive testimony from industry experts about how the proposal will work for small businesses and meet the JOBS Act goal of getting capital to small businesses.
