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The Committee on Small Business will meet for a hearing titled, *Small Business Tax Reform: Growth Through Simplicity*. The hearing is scheduled to begin at **1:00 P.M. on April 10, 2013 in Room 2360 of the Rayburn House Office Building.**

The purpose of the hearing is to receive testimony on several proposals to reform and simplify the tax code. Over time, our tax code has become more complex and truly temporary, with tax relief being extended for one year, for months at a time or even retroactively. Taxpayers, and particularly small business owners, are spending more of their time and resources to comply with and adjust to onerous tax laws, instead of investing those resources and assets back in their businesses to grow. This hearing represents an opportunity for members to explore different proposals designed to simplify and reform the tax code.
