Dear Mr. Blum:

The House Committee on Small Business (the Committee) writes to inquire about the recent proposed rule change to the Federal Acquisition Regulation (FAR). This rule would require certain federal contractors to disclose greenhouse gas emissions and monetary climate-related risks, along with requiring them to create targets to reduce emissions.<sup>1</sup> As outlined by the U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) Office of Advocacy, the fixed costs imposed by the rule will disproportionately impact small businesses in the federal contracting space.<sup>2</sup> This is especially troubling when considering that new small business federal contracts have fallen by 60 percent over the last decade.<sup>3</sup> It appears that the FAR Council may not have properly considered small entities during this rulemaking process.

It is important for agencies to properly consider small businesses interests, which make up 99.9 percent of all businesses in the United States, when passing any new rule. America's small businesses deserve to have their voices heard and considered. We therefore request the following information as soon as possible but no later than June 22, 2023:

1. What are your statutory requirements to examine this rule's impact on small businesses?
2. How many small businesses will be impacted by this rule?
3. What additional compliance costs on small businesses are associated with this new rule?
4. Where can small businesses go to examine your analysis on the impacts this rule will have on their operations?
