3. Witnesses should also provide a short biographical summary or CV and submit it electronically to Jeff.Leieritz@mail.house.gov no later than 48 hours prior to the start of the hearing.
4. Prior to the start of the hearing, witnesses should provide 75 copies of their written testimony to Jeff Leieritz, 2361 Rayburn House Office Building. One additional copy should be delivered to Mory Garcia in the Minority office, B-343 Rayburn House Office Building.
5. Please do not send copies by U.S. Mail, UPS, Federal Express, or any other shippers. Such packages are processed through an offsite security facility and will arrive late. If you do not have a Washington, D.C. area office or contact to deliver the testimony, please contact Jeff Leieritz at Jeff.Leieritz@mail.house.gov or (202) 225-5821.
6. At the hearing, each witness will be asked to orally summarize his or her testimony in 5 minutes. Written testimony may extend to any reasonable length and will be entered into the hearing record.
7. Written testimony will be available to the public and will be posted on the Committee website.

According to Committee Rules, failure to submit testimony and other materials by the deadlines may be grounds for excluding both the oral and written testimony of the witness unless waived by the Chairman.
